



The list of celebrities continues to grow for the 4th Annual Anne Murray Charity Golf Classic in support of Colon Cancer Canada

There will be a little more song and dance at the 4th Annual Anne Murray Charity Golf Classic in support of Colon Cancer Canada thanks to the addition of three more players to the ever-growing list of celebrity supporters. "Our fourth tournament is shaping up to be the most spectacular to date," said Bunnie Schwartz, Co-Founder and President of Colon Cancer Canada. "We are overwhelmed with the continued support of Anne Murray and these many celebrities that she always manages to bring with her.
